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14 **CONSENT AGREEMENT**

15 As Elizabeth Hogan ("Ms. Hogan") has petitioned the Arizona State Board of  
16 Pharmacy (the "Board") for reinstatement of her pharmacist license and, consistent with  
17 the public interest, statutory requirements and the responsibilities of the Board under  
18 A.R.S. §§ 32-1901, *et. seq.*, the Board and Ms. Hogan enter into the following Recitals,  
19 Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order ("Consent Agreement") for the  
20 reinstatement of Ms. Hogan's Pharmacist License No. S015072 with probation.

21 1. Ms. Hogan has read and understands this Consent Agreement and has had  
22 the opportunity to discuss this Consent Agreement with an attorney, or has waived the  
23 opportunity to discuss this Consent Agreement with an attorney.

24 2. By entering into this Consent Agreement, Ms. Hogan knowingly and  
25 voluntarily relinquishes all right to any administrative hearing, as well as rights of  
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1 rehearing, review, reconsideration, appeal, judicial review or any other administrative  
2 and/or judicial action, concerning the matters set forth herein.

3           3. Ms. Hogan affirmatively agrees that this Consent Agreement shall be  
4 irrevocable.

5           4. Ms. Hogan acknowledges and agrees that, upon signing this Consent  
6 Agreement and returning this document to the Board's Executive Director, she may not  
7 revoke her acceptance of the Consent Agreement or make any modifications to the  
8 document regardless of whether the Consent Agreement has been signed by the  
9 Executive Director. Any modification to this original document is ineffective and void  
10 unless mutually agreed by the parties in writing.

11           5. Ms. Hogan understands that the Consent Agreement shall not become  
12 effective unless and until signed by the Board's Executive Director.

13           6. If a court of competent jurisdiction rules that any part of this Consent  
14 Agreement is void or otherwise unenforceable, the remainder of the Consent Agreement  
15 shall remain in full force and effect.

16           7. Ms. Hogan understands that this Consent Agreement is a public record that  
17 may be publicly disseminated as a formal action of the Board and may be reported as  
18 required by law to the National Practitioner Data Bank and the Healthcare Integrity and  
19 Protection Data Bank.


20           8. Ms. Hogan understands that any violation of this Consent Agreement  
21 constitutes unprofessional conduct and may result in disciplinary action. A.R.S. §§ 32-  
22 1901.01(B)(20), -1927(A)(1).

24 Conclusions of Law and Order.

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

10 FINDINGS OF FACT

- 11 1. The Board is the duly constituted authority for licensing and regulating  
12 the practice of pharmacy in the State of Arizona.
- 13 2. Ms. Hogan was the holder of license number S015072 to practice as a  
14 pharmacist in the State of Arizona.
- 15 3. On January 28, 2008, Ms. Hogan surrendered her pharmacist license  
16 pursuant to the Consent Agreement and Order for Surrender in Board Case No. 08-0009-  
17 PHR.
- 18 4. At the Board's September 2009 Board Meeting, Ms. Hogan requested  
19 that the Board reinstate her license. The Board voted to reinstate Ms. Hogan's license  
20 subject to certain conditions.

21 CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 22 1. The Board possesses jurisdiction over the subject matter and over Ms.  
23 Hogan pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-1901 *et seq.*

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1 to the Board a written acknowledgement that they have received a copy of this  
2 Consent Agreement within ten (10) days of entering into an employment  
3 relationship with Ms. Hogan.

4 d. Ms. Hogan shall not serve as a preceptor pharmacist or pharmacist in  
5 charge.

6 e. Ms. Hogan shall advise the Board within ten (10) days of any change  
7 in pharmacy employment status.

8 f. Within five (5) years from the beginning of Ms. Hogan's  
9 probationary period, Ms. Hogan shall complete 400 hours of community service  
10 approved by Board staff. Ms. Hogan shall ensure that all entities to which she  
11 provides community service verify in writing to the Board the number of hours  
12 completed within 30 days of completing the community service.

13 g. Throughout the term of Ms. Hogan's probation, Ms. Hogan shall  
14 personally appear before the Board when requested to do so by the Board or Board  
15 staff.

16 h. Ms. Hogan shall obey all federal and state laws and rules governing  
17 the practice of pharmacy.

18 k. No sooner than five (5) years from the effective date of this Order,  
19 Ms. Hogan shall request in writing that the Board terminate her probation. Ms.  
20 Hogan's request for termination will be considered at a regularly scheduled Board  
21 meeting. Ms. Hogan is required to personally appear at that Board meeting. Ms.  
22 Hogan's probationary period will continue until Ms. Hogan's request for  
23 termination is received and the Board terminates the probation.

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3. Ms. Hogan shall furnish the Board with a list of all jurisdictions in which she maintains or has maintained licensure in the profession of pharmacy along with the registration numbers of said licenses.

4. Within **thirty (30) days** of the effective date of this Consent Agreement, Ms. Hogan shall successfully complete and provide proof of successful completion to the Board of thirty (30) contact hours (3.0 C.E.U.) of American Council on Pharmaceutical Education (ACPE) courses. The courses shall be in included in the requirements of A.R.S. § 32-1936 and A.A.C. R4-23-204.

5. If Ms. Hogan violates this Order in any way or fails to fulfill the requirements of this Order, the Board, after giving the Ms. Hogan notice and the opportunity to be heard, may revoke, suspend or take other disciplinary actions against Ms. Hogan's license. The issue at such a hearing will be limited solely to whether this Order has been violated.
