13 **CONSENT AGREEMENT**

14 As Eric Boel ("Applicant") has made application to the Arizona State Board of
15 Pharmacy (the "Board") for licensure as a pharmacist by reciprocity and, consistent with
16 the public interest, statutory requirements and the responsibilities of the Board under
17 A.R.S. § 32-1901, *et. seq.*, the Board and Applicant enter into the following Recitals,
18 Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order ("Consent Agreement") for licensure
19 with probation.

20 1. Applicant has read and understands this Consent Agreement and has had
21 the opportunity to discuss this Consent Agreement with an attorney, or has waived the
22 opportunity to discuss this Consent Agreement with an attorney.

23 2. By entering into this Consent Agreement, Applicant knowingly and
24 voluntarily relinquishes all right to an administrative hearing, as well as rights of
25 rehearing, review, reconsideration, appeal, judicial review or any other administrative
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1 and/or judicial action, concerning the matters set forth herein.

2 3. Applicant affirmatively agrees that this Consent Agreement shall be
3 irrevocable.

4 4. Applicant acknowledges and agrees that, upon signing this Consent
5 Agreement and returning this document to the Board's Executive Director, he may not
6 revoke his acceptance of the Consent Agreement or make any modifications to the
7 document regardless of whether the Consent Agreement has been signed by the
8 Executive Director. Any modification to this original document is ineffective and void
9 unless mutually agreed by the parties in writing.

10 5. Applicant understands that the Consent Agreement shall not become
11 effective unless and until approved by the Board and signed by the Board's Executive
12 Director.

13 6. If a court of competent jurisdiction rules that any part of this Consent
14 Agreement is void or otherwise unenforceable, the remainder of the Consent Agreement
15 shall remain in full force and effect.

16 7. Applicant understands that this Consent Agreement is a public record that
17 may be publicly disseminated as a formal action of the Board and may be reported as
18 required by law to the National Practitioner Data Bank and the Healthcare Integrity and
19 Protection Data Bank.

20 8. Applicant understands that any violation of this Consent Agreement
21 constitutes unprofessional conduct and may result in disciplinary action. A.R.S. § 32-
22 1901.01(B) (20) and A.R.S. § 1927(A) (1).

23 9. Applicant agrees that the Board will adopt the following Findings of Fact,
24 Conclusions of Law and Order.

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

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Board is the duly constituted authority for licensing and regulating the practice of pharmacy in the State of Arizona.
2. Applicant has applied for licensure as a pharmacist by reciprocity in the State of Arizona.
3. On October 25, 2007, Applicant's Iowa pharmacist license was disciplined pursuant to a Decision and Order in Iowa Case Nos. 2005-83 and 2006-063.
4. The October 25, 2007 Iowa Pharmacy Board Decision and Order placed Applicant's Iowa pharmacy license on probation for a period of five (5) years, required that he completed additional hours of continuing education and prohibited him from serving as a manager, pharmacist in charge or a preceptor.
5. Applicant is currently licensed as a pharmacist and working in Iowa.
6. At the Board's September 27-28, 2011 Board Meeting, the Board voted to license Applicant subject to certain conditions.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

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e. Applicant shall furnish the Board with a list of all jurisdictions in which he maintains or has maintained licensure in the profession of pharmacy along with the registration numbers of said licenses.

f. Applicant shall obey all federal and state laws and rules governing the practice of pharmacy.

g. If Applicant violates this order in any way or fails to fulfill the requirements of this order, the Board, after giving the respondent notice and the opportunity to be heard, may revoke, suspend or take other disciplinary actions against the Respondent's license. The issue at such a hearing will be limited solely to whether this order has been violated.

h. Applicant shall appear before the Board at a regularly scheduled Board meeting one (1) year after the effective date of this Order to request that the probation imposed by this Order be terminated. Applicant's failure to petition the Board to terminate the probation shall extend the probation period.
