7 Pursuant to the foregoing Consent to Entry of Order, the evidence and
8 records compiled and contained in the file for DAVID R. ORNELAS and for good
9 cause appearing, the Board on this day of , 1991 enters
10 the following Finding of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Board Order in the
11 Matter of 91-09-H.

12 FINDINGS OF FACT

13 I

14 1. DAVID R. ORNELAS is the holder of Intern Certificate of Registration
15 Number 3267 issued by the Arizona State Board of Pharmacy which permits the
16 holder to practice as a pharmacy intern in the State of Arizona.

17 2. That on the 30th day of April , 1991 DAVID R. ORNELAS did enter into
18 a Consent to Entry of Order with the Arizona State Board of Pharmacy admitting
19 that the factual allegations contained in Notice of Hearing Number 91-09-H are
20 true and accurate.

21 3. That DAVID R. ORNELAS admits to violations of A.R.S. § 32-1927(A)(5) to
22 wit: that he is addicted to the use of liquor or drugs to such a degree as
23 to render him unfit, in the opinion of the board, to practice as a pharmacy
24 intern.

1 b. Respondent shall further enroll in a Board approved aftercare
2 program and attend at least two (2) support meetings per month. Respondent
3 shall cause the director of said program to submit reports on attendance
4 at said meetings on or about the 10th day of each month beginning the first
5 month the Pharmacists Assisting Pharmacists of Arizona program is not in
6 place.

7 3. Respondent shall bear all responsibility for the release of information
8 forms and reports as directed by the Order.

9 4. Respondent shall bear all costs for testing, rehabilitation aftercare
10 programs and reports to be filed.

11 5. Respondent shall "hold harmless" the provider of any required reports
12 to the Board of Pharmacy.

13 6. Respondent shall pay all fees throughout the term of probation to
14 maintain Intern Certificate of Registration Number 3267 or any other permit that
15 the Arizona State Board of Pharmacy might issue to the Respondent in the future.

16 7. Respondent shall obey all the laws and rules governing the practice of
17 pharmacy or pharmacy intern.

18 8. Respondent shall appear before the Arizona State Board of Pharmacy
19 on or after May 30, 1996 to show cause why Probation should be terminated.

20 9. If the Respondent violates this Order in any way or fails to fulfill
21 the requirements of this Order, the Board, after giving the Respondent Notice
22 and the opportunity to be heard, may revoke, suspend or take other disciplinary
23 action against the Respondent.

24 10. Should the Respondent become licensed as a pharmacist by the Arizona
25 State Board of Pharmacy during the term of probation, any and all of the
26 terms of probation contained herein shall be extended to the pharmacy permit
so issued.
