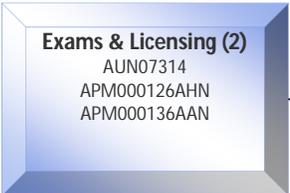
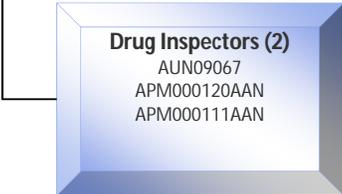
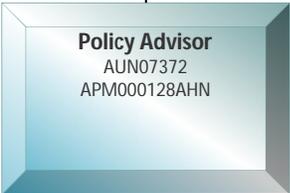

Dear Governor,

I am pleased to provide you with an annual report for fiscal year 2011. The Board of Pharmacy (Board) experienced another busy year and has accomplished its mission, which is to protect the public health and safety, as well as continuing the process of licensing individuals and approving permit applications for non-prescription retailers, medical gas facilities, pharmacies, drug wholesalers and drug manufacturing facilities. This was done within the budget authorized by your office and the legislature.

This year the Board and the Arizona Pharmacy Alliance initiated, the legislature passed and you signed Senate Bill 1298 which expanded pharmacist's authorization to immunize patients for influenza and other diseases to certified pharmacy interns working under the supervision of certified pharmacist immunizers. In addition, children between 7-18 years of age were added to the types of patients authorized to be immunized by those pharmacists and interns as defined in the session law changes to A.R.S. § 32-1974. There were 2,195 certified immunizers as of 6/30/2011.

The bill also streamlined the process by which qualified pharmacists may enter into collaborative practice agreements with prescribers that allow the pharmacists to implement and modify drug therapies according to pre-approved protocols. The types of facilities where collaborative practice agreements can be utilized were also expanded significantly. The changes were defined in the session law changes to A.R.S. § 32-1970.

The Board continues to fund and operate the controlled substance prescription monitoring program (CSPMP). As of June 30, 2011, the CSPMP program monitored the activity of 23,266 prescribers, and 5,358 dispensers. During the 2011 fiscal year, the program has provided 552,050 reports to prescribers, patients, professional boards, various state agencies and law enforcement. The activities of the CSPMP are designed to identify and prevent the misuse and abuse and unlawful diversion of prescription controlled substances which has been increasing at an alarming rate here in the state and in the rest of the nation.

I have provided a table that briefly summarizes some important statistical information about the Board's 2011 fiscal year activities, during which time the Board held seven Board meetings.
